This ESGE Guideline provides a framework for the endoscopic management of individuals with Lynch syndrome. Furthermore, we aimed to propose a definition of familial risk of colorectal cancer to identify the group of individuals in whom colonoscopy surveillance is justified. The current guideline gives an overview of the limited studies published on this topic and in addition we have performed a Delphi process to gain consensus among the expert opinions.
